Applicants may choose the general Fulbright TEA pedagogy program or apply for a cohort focused on gender, media literacy or climate education. Selected finalists will participate in a six-week exchange program in the United States in 2025, take academic seminars at a host university, and observe and share their expertise with U.S. teachers and students at host university and at local secondary schools in the U.S. in 2025. Application deadline is **March 25, 2024**.
